Heathercote House The Common, Silchester, Reading, Hampshire, RG7 2PG £1,900,000

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Every so often, a house comes to the market that becomes woven into the history of its village.

Originally formed in 1910 from a pair of traditional cottages and described in The Book of Silchester as a "quaint bijou gentleman's residence", it remains one of the village's most distinctive Arts & Crafts homes. Set behind a private driveway and surrounded by beautifully landscaped gardens, Heathercote House offers something increasingly difficult to find — timeless character, complete privacy and direct access to over 600 acres of unspoilt heathland, where every walk begins from your own front gate.

This is a home that encourages a slower pace of life. Morning coffee in the sunroom overlooking the gardens, afternoons tending the productive kitchen garden, evenings entertaining beneath mature trees, and weekend walks through one of Berkshire's most beautiful landscapes. Heathercote House is not simply a period home; it is a lifestyle that has remained largely unchanged for over a century.

From the moment you arrive beneath its covered loggia and admire the black and white timber framing beneath its handmade clay tiled elevations, it becomes immediately apparent that this is a home with genuine architectural significance. Sympathetically preserved over many decades, it has retained the warmth, craftsmanship and individuality that define the very best Arts & Crafts homes.

The welcoming reception hall forms the heart of the house, where a beautiful brick fireplace and wood-burning stove immediately create an atmosphere of comfort and character. From here, the accommodation unfolds naturally, with each room possessing its own distinct personality whilst remaining wonderfully connected for modern family living.

The drawing room is undoubtedly one of the home's finest spaces. Filled with natural light from its elegant bay window and centred around the original open fireplace, it provides an inviting setting throughout the seasons. Beyond, the adjoining sunroom, with glazed bi-fold doors opening onto the terrace, effortlessly blurs the line between house and garden, creating a wonderful space for entertaining or simply enjoying the peaceful surroundings.

The formal dining room reflects the home's Arts & Crafts heritage with its timber flooring and carefully preserved detailing, while the adjoining study provides an ideal retreat for home working or quieter moments.

At the heart of everyday life sits the bespoke oak kitchen. Designed around the traditional Aga, it combines timeless craftsmanship with modern practicality through granite worktops, quality integrated appliances and generous space for informal family dining. A walk-in pantry and substantial utility room ensure the house functions as beautifully as it looks.

The first floor continues the feeling of generosity and character. The principal bedroom enjoys a beautiful bay window together with a walk-in wardrobe, while four further bedrooms offer flexible accommodation for family and guests. Two family bathrooms and extensive built-in storage ensure the home remains practical without compromising its period charm.

A particularly delightful surprise is the rooftop viewing platform, where elevated views stretch across the surrounding countryside and heathland, providing a unique perspective over one of Berkshire's most beautiful landscapes.

Outside, Heathercote House becomes something altogether special.

The gardens have been carefully designed as a series of outdoor rooms, enclosed by mature yew hedging and high walls to create remarkable privacy. Sweeping lawns, ornamental planting, gravel pathways, water features and secluded terraces encourage outdoor living throughout the changing seasons.

The productive kitchen garden, complete with raised beds and block-paved pathways, offers the opportunity to embrace a more self-sufficient lifestyle, while the beautifully restored vinery provides an inspiring space equally suited as an artist's studio, home office, gym or garden room.

The extensive collection of outbuildings further enhances the property's versatility. Workshops, garages, stores and ancillary buildings provide exceptional flexibility, whether for classic cars, hobbies, business use or future adaptation.

Perhaps the greatest luxury of all lies beyond the garden gate. With more than 600 acres of protected commonland immediately surrounding the property, every day begins with the freedom to explore one of Berkshire's finest natural landscapes. Whether walking the dog, enjoying an early morning run or simply watching the changing seasons unfold, few homes offer such a remarkable connection to the countryside.

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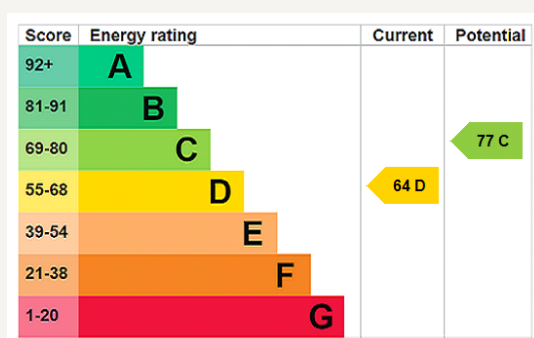
