

Manor Farm House, London Road, Silk Willoughby, Sleaford



DESCRIPTION

Manor Farm is an elegant stone-built former farmhouse that combines handsome Georgian proportions with earlier architectural features, creating a property full of history and charm. Set well back from the road behind a sweeping gravel driveway, the house enjoys a peaceful setting within established grounds framed by mature trees.

The accommodation extends across two floors and retains a wealth of period features, including high ceilings, deep sash windows, original fireplaces, and exposed beams.

The welcoming entrance hall gives access to the principal reception rooms. The sitting room is particularly impressive, with a large bay window overlooking the garden, feature fireplace, and decorative cornicing, a wonderful space for entertaining. The formal dining room is equally generous, with arched alcoves and plenty of natural light, making it perfect for hosting family gatherings.

The kitchen/breakfast room is the heart of the home, fitted with a range-style cooker and ample space for family dining. A utility room, boiler room, pantry, and cloakroom provide excellent practical space.
